Or identify topics and ask presenters? • Well-facilitated + graphic facilitation • 25 people or less per group? (12-15 groups?) <p>Outcome: regional strategy recommendations for the issue (e.g. “jobs equity”)</p>

From the community: what community wants, next steps, how electeds/foundations can support 2. Elected/funder reflect back what they hear / how they can support 3. Prepare report-back of action steps – what this community will be doing around equitable development Methods <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Structured questions • Well-facilitated • Graphic note-taking / facilitation Outcome: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Community-specific / place-based strategy rec's • Start building coalitions Q: Geographic scale? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Generally, break out into city. • In large cities like Seattle, perhaps break into north/south/west? • Unincorporated areas can meet together (White Center, etc)
